## Paul the People Pleaser?

Last week we heard St. Paul saying that he was all things to all people. This week we hear that he tried to please everyone. To modern ears, that sounds more like a used-car salesman who has just the right deal for any buyer. But that wasn't what Paul meant. The key to Paul's way of life is the last line of the second reading: "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:1).

Remember when Paul was still Saul, the Pharisee who persecuted Christians? When he was struck by lightning he heard, not thunder, but the voice of Jesus, who asked why Saul was persecuting him. Paul later began to understand that all Christians make up the body of Christ. As members of that body, we can show others what Jesus is like by our example. That seems to be a two-part process.

First, to show Christ, we have to know Christ. We can do that by reading the scriptures and praying with them. We can receive the sacraments regularly, especially reconciliation, in which we experience God's forgiveness and love, and the Eucharist, in which Jesus unites himself with us so that we can become more like him. The second part is acting like Jesus. If we want people to see Christ in us, we don't dress like him or grow a beard. We have to do things as Jesus would: forgive people who hurt us; care for the sick, the dying, the poor. Don't be afraid to tell people what God has done for you; encourage others to be grateful for what God has done for them. Pray with people who have difficulty talking to God.

Paul obviously didn't please everyone, or he wouldn't have ended his life in prison. He was more interested in pleasing God by spreading the Good News of Jesus' resurrection. If we can imitate Paul in that way, we can't go wrong.

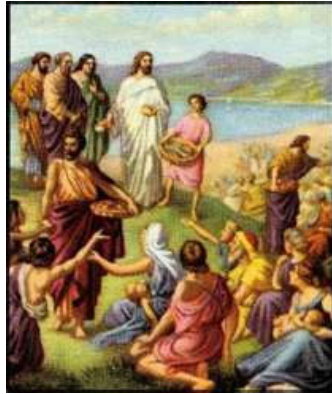
## In Today's Reading

## Lenten Requirements-Fasting, Abstinence and Penance

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of lent.

Fasting as explained by the U.S. Bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening-depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal. Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.

Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, consommé, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are not forbidden. So it is permissible to use margarine and lard. Even bacon drippings which contain little bits of meat may be poured over lettuce as seasoning.

Moral theologians remind us that some people are excused from fasting and/or abstinence because of sickness or other reasons.

The Code of Canon Law and our Bishops remind us of other works and means of doing penance: prayer, acts of self-denial, almsgiving and works of personal charity. Attending Mass daily or several times a week, praying the rosary, making the way of the cross, attending the Parish evening prayer service, teaching the illiterate to read, reading to the blind, helping at a soup kitchen, visiting the sick and shut-ins and giving an overworked mother a break by baby sitting-all of these can be even more meaningful and demanding than simply abstaining from meat on Friday.

## A Perfect Time to Create a Lead Trust:

The applicable federal rate of 1.4% is very low right now, making it a great time to set up a Lead Trust. A Lead Trust will provide gifts to charity for a fixed number of years beginning now, and then, at the end of the term of years, the remainder of the trust will pass to your children or grandchildren. Depending on how it is set up you could avoid gift tax or even capital gain tax. You can name your parish endowment fund as the charitable beneficiary of the trust for the years it is in effect. **Amendment 1** (Ratified 12/15/1791) Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

Our Archbishop has called our attention to a policy by the current president's administration that seriously threatens our rights as Christians under the first amendment. The practice of our faith, which the constitution expressly honors and protects, does not allow us to participate in any way in the killing of children in the womb. We are, as Catholics, unwilling as medical professionals or in any other capacity to knowingly contribute to the deliberate termination of a pregnancy. The current policy obligates us to participate in such practices.

The other evening, at a gathering of the Serra Club of Atlanta honoring the priests of the Archdiocese, the Archbishop forcefully spoke to us about this issue. He said that this is not a time to argue about particular procedures or even the questions of abortion or contraception. This is a debate about the Constitution of the United States and whether we are to be protected by that constitution or not.
